4th Annual Coordination Meeting of the UNESCO World Heritage-related Category 2 Institutes and Centres Shanghai, China, 23-25 May 2014

Concept Note and Draft Agenda (Final Draft of 7 March 2014)

Introduction and background

The fourth annual coordination meeting of the UNESCO World Heritage-related Category 2 (C2) Institutes and Centres will take place in Shanghai, China, from 23 to 25 May 2014. The World Heritage Institute of Training and Research for the Asia and the Pacific region (WHITRAP), supported by Tongji University and the Shanghai Tongji Urban Planning and Design Institute, will host the meeting.

The meeting follows **Resolution 17 GA 9**, adopted by the General Assembly of States Parties to the World Heritage Convention in 2009; as well as the first annual meeting hosted by the Ministry of Culture of the Kingdom of Bahrain (in Manama, 19–20 December 2010); the second meeting hosted by the Research Centre on the Economics of Culture and World Heritage Studies (Turin Centre) and IULM University (in Milan 21–23 January 2012); and the third meeting hosted by the Nordic World Heritage Foundation (in Oslo 3–5 March 2013).

This draft concept note outlines the objective, expected outcome and draft agenda of the meeting, will be shared with the World Heritage Centre and sent to all the established C2 Institutes and Centres which will be invited to the meeting. The final agenda will be shared before the meeting.

Objective of the meeting

The objective of the 4th annual meeting of the World Heritage-related C2 Institutes and Centres is to build institutional capacity through a focus on international cooperation, the process of External Evaluation, and the Results-Based Management (RBM) approach of the C2 Institutes and Centres.

Relevant frameworks for the meeting include the World Heritage Capacity Building Strategy adopted by the Committee in 2011 (whc11-35com-9Be), UNESCO Medium Term Strategy (2014-2021)/ (37 C/4) and Programme and Budget for 2014-2017 (37 C/5 Document), the *Strategic Action Plan for the Implementation of the Convention 2012-2022* (adopted by the 18GA in 2011), the Kyoto Vision and the *Implementation of the Guidelines and Criteria for Category 2 Institutes and Centres* (document 35C/22).

Expected outcome of the meeting

The meeting will follow up on the three previous annual meetings by producing a report and recommendations that will come out of the various presentations and discussions, which will be presented to the World Heritage Committee (at its 38th Session in 2014).
